

Fun tip 1: How many days in a month? Count your knuckles!

Have you ever had trouble remembering how many days each month in the year has?

Does July have 30 days or 31 days? How about September?

Here is a fun way to remember:

- 1) Make your hand into a fist so you can see your knuckles
- 2) Each knuckle and trough (space between two knuckles) stands for a month in the year
- 3) Months that fall on the knuckles have 31 days while months that fall in the troughs have 30 days. Of course, the exception is February with 28 days (except in a leap year when it has 29 days)
- 4) Here is how it goes:

Little (pinky) finger's knuckle-January (31 days)

Trough-February

Ring finger's knuckle-March (31 days)

Trough-Apr (30 days)

Middle (tall) finger's knuckle-May (31 days)

Trough-June (30 days)

Index (pointing) finger's knuckle July (31 days)

Start again with the little finger:

Little (pinky) finger's knuckle-August (31 days), Trough-September (30 days), and so on.




Fun tip 2: Colors in a rainbow Do you get the colors in a rainbow mixed up? VIBGYOR is an easy acronym to recall the colors of a rainbow in the order they appear. V-Violet I-Indigo B-Blue G-Green Y-Yellow O-Orange R-Red
